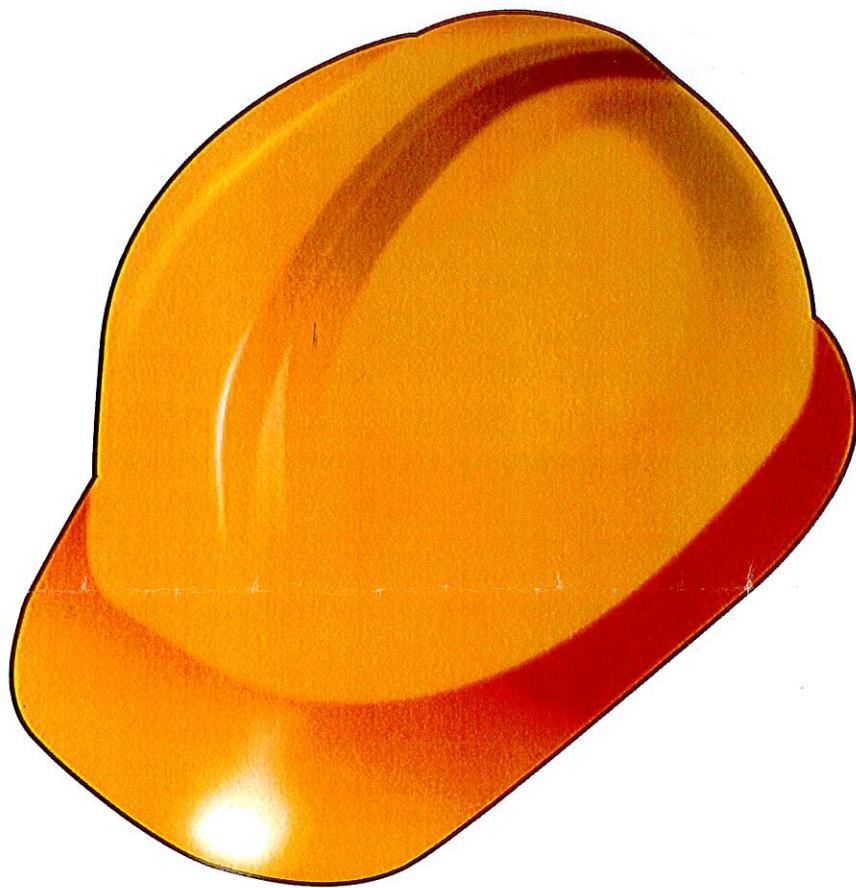

**TERM:** On-the job training - 5 years (8,000 hours minimum)  
Related Instruction - 2 Years Day School with additional three years of evening Classes  
Starting Wage - \$14.24 per hour  
Current Journeyman's Rate - \$35.60 per hour  
Fringe Benefits - Hospitalization, Pensions and Annuity  
No cost for school

**QUALIFICATIONS**

To qualify for oral interview an applicant must meet all the following basic requirements unless he/she has a minimum of 2,000 hours or more of substantiated electrical construction work experience and sits for the Electrical Trade's Aptitude Test.

**AGE:** Must be at least 18 years old by December 31 of the year of acceptance

**EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS:** High School Graduate or G.E.D. (proof required)  
Minimum of one year of high school Algebra or post secondary Algebra with a passing grade (TRANSCRIPTS MUST BE PROVIDED BY APPLICANT IN A SEALED ENVELOPE FROM THE SCHOOL)

**PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS:** Physically Fit  
Applicants selected for the program will be required to take a chemical urinalysis test.

**TRANSPORTATION REQUIREMENTS:** Applicants must possess and maintain a valid driver's license  
Apprentices are responsible for providing their own transportation

**APTITUDE TEST:** Upon meeting above qualifications, Applicant will be required to obtain a qualifying score of "4" or higher using the electrical trade's aptitude test developed and validated by the American Institute for Research. Cost is a \$25.00 NON-REFUNDABLE processing fee, payable by Money Order or Cashier's Check.
